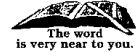

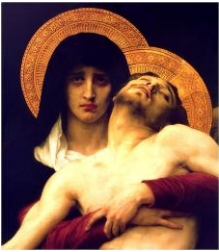

**Fresh BREAD Updates: Bread had two victories this summer:**

1) Jobs Initiative- The Columbus City Council revised its requirements for city construction contracts to include provision favoring companies that hire those who have served time. Thanks go to Council Member Elizabeth Brown for working with BREAD to get this ordinance passed. 2) Reduce Crime and Violence- The city is going to start a program called the Safe Neighborhood Initiative to work with individuals on probation to assist them with finding jobs, counseling, or learning life skills. This model is used in 30 other cities and has helped to reduce violent crime. There must be community buy-in, the support of law enforcement, and resources invested to target the recidivism. BREAD worked with Public Safety Director George Speaks for three years on this initiative. These two issues came out of the listening sessions last year, and St. Dominic BREAD team will have the listening sessions this year after both masses on October 1 and October 22, We want to hear from you. The BREAD investment drive is also taking place now. Donations can be made at Friendship Sunday or to a BREAD member. For every dollar invested, BREAD returns \$5 to the community. BREAD Columbus is supported by membership fees, corporate donations, and network members. But the organization belongs to us, and the community requires your financial support working for justice.
