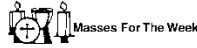

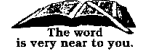

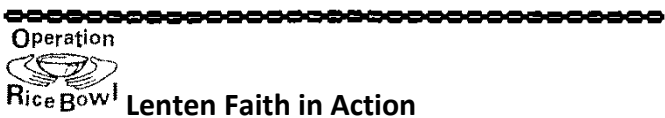

Why We Pray the Our Father, the Glory Be and the Hail Mary at the end of mass.

A couple of years ago we started saying three prayers after the closing hymn of mass on Sundays- the Our Father, the Glory Be, and the Hail Mary and I often get a lot of questions as to why. First, the reason we started doing that was that a brother priest suggested it and does it at his parish.

He told me that the things we are praying for are twofold. One, we are offering Thanksgiving for the Eucharistic liturgy that we just celebrated and we are offering that as a community. (Some of you may have been taught to do this individually after mass when you were a kid. Same thing, just doing it as a group).

Second, we are praying for the priest who will attend to us at the hour of our death. I do a lot of "Last Rites" for people that I have never met before. The hospital calls and I go. Sometimes I do it for parishioners or people I have known for a long time. Either way, it is a special moment.

Hopefully, someday when we are getting ready to leave this world a priest will come and attend to us as well. So, we are praying for that priest now. He may be around now, or he may be on his way to ordination, and for some of us, maybe hasn't even been born yet. So those prayers at the end help us to remember our mortality and to pray for the priest who will usher us into heaven with the Sacraments.
