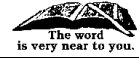

AUGUSTUS TOLTON PLAY

Augustus Tolton was born into slavery in Missouri in 1854. He is regarded as the first African American priest ordained in the United States in 1886. No American seminary would accept a black man and some local priest tutored him privately until he was admitted as a special student at St. Francis Solanus College. Tolton finally was able to study for the priesthood in Europe attending Urban College of the Sacred Congregation de Propaganda Fide in Rome. Those who attended the Black Catholic Congress last year in Orlando were able to view a snippet of the play about this man in the canonization process for sainthood at the Vatican. This one-man play about the life of Tolton is coming to Columbus on November 10 and 11, 2018. There will be two productions each day and we need volunteers to assist in this fundraiser for the next Black Catholic Congress in 2022.
