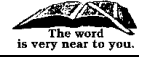

The Community Garden has been put to sleep for the winter. It was a record year for tomatoes, peppers, okra, cucumbers and zucchini. We even had a few eggplants. Rain and sun cooperated to make those plants successful. We had kale and collards and they are the remaining survivors in this cold weather. We distributed more than 300lbs of vegetables during Community Kitchen days and we used vegetables from the garden the Festival for a little tasting. Last week we tore out all the plants and dug out the canna lilies. If you planted canna lilies they should be dug up asap if not already before to ground freezes. Shake off the dirt and place in a bag, not sealed tightly and place in a basement or garage. Expect that the bulbs or tubers have multiplied from the few you planted. Next Spring, you'll be able to plant again and share some with friends. Thanks to all who helped make the garden the best yield yet. Thanks Monica Stith, Rachele Hines-White, Kim and Nicole, Terri Bland, Veronica Carter, Pam Slater and Veda Wise and the workers from Franklin County programs. Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority supported the garden with time and money for plants and structures. Think about next year and consider helping out in the garden. It is rewarding and miraculous to see nature progress from a seed to a mature plant. Faith, Hope and Love go hand in hand to culminate in a successful harvest.
