The Catholic Church responds to disasters! In the United States: Catholic Charities USA responds to flooding in Iowa, Nebraska and Missouri. The current round of flooding triggered by a "bomb cyclone" storm and is expected to persist across several states.

Additionally, snowmelt and spring rains could create additional flooding in the weeks ahead.

AccuWeather Meteorologist Paul Pastelok said, "El Nino is likely to persist through the spring and not weaken like it usually does this time of year."

Translation: While the storms probably won't reach "bomb cyclone" intensity, there will remain the risk of strong storms into May.
