Mass & Ministry Training

Next on the parish training schedule is the seminar on the Mass, Saturday, August 31, from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. in the parish center. We do hope you plan to attend by signing the Sign-Up Sheet located on the table in the front entrance of the Church.

Following the Seminar on the Mass is Lector training for both 8 a.m. and 11:30 a.m. We are asking both current lectors who want to continue to lector attend the training as well as any new, aspiring lectors. Lector Training is Saturday, September 14, in the Church from 10 a.m. -12:00 noon. There are 10 lectors listed for the 8:00 a.m. Mass and 13 lectors listed for 11:30 a.m. Mass. However, only half of those listed as lectors for 11:30a.m. follow the schedule. We strongly urge you to attend this training to help us obtain an accurate Lector List. This will ensure that everyone will be scheduled and have an opportunity to lector. Lectors are needed for both Masses, 8:00 a.m. and 11:30 a.m.

Lector training on September 14 will be for adults only. Lector training for youth will be done during Parish School of Religion (PSR). Both boys and girls are encouraged to lector. All youth lectors must have completed the Sacrament of First Communion.

As you know, Eucharistic Ministers’ Training had to be rescheduled. We are in the process of determining an appropriate date to reschedule this training.
