Men's Prayer Breakfast will be held on the second Saturday of each month at 9am. All men 18 and older are welcome.

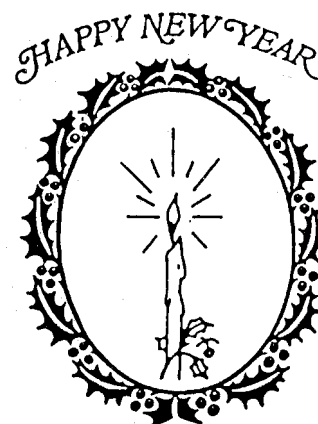
