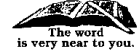

Given the growing need for foster care here in Central Ohio, we are expanding our Foster Care program to reach more children in need. Thousands of children across Ohio are in need of stable, consistent and loving homes. SVFC matches children in Ohio who need a place of respite and stability with foster parents who provide loving, nurturing temporary homes. SVFC offers an intimate, family-oriented approach to supporting foster parents. As a small agency, SVFC provides expert training, 24/7 support, one-on-one-coaching, and access to our social-emotional health services and our behavioral health experts to offer the support needed to foster a child.

As Christians, we are encouraged to open our lives to the most vulnerable, and there is no better way to embody the Lord's love and grace than caring for those who have no one else to care for them. God is called a father to the fatherless and a defender of the weak, and those who have been adopted into his family are called to walk in his ways. Those who are called to do so can lean on their faith, commitment and generosity to aid a child in need by becoming a foster parent and offering them a bright light of hope.
