**What is BREAD?** BREAD is a multi-faith organization that works for social justice in Franklin County. The BREAD mission is taken from Micah 6:8-"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and walk humbly with your God.
