**BREAD BOX**

What is BREAD? BREAD is a multi-faith organization that works for social justice in Franklin County. The BREAD mission is taken from Micah 6:8- "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and walk humbly with your God.

What can you do? St. Dominic is a member of BREAD. This is the easiest part – all you have to do is be present at the Nehemiah Action on Tuesday, May 11<sup>th</sup> at 6:45pm. There will be a car rally at the First Church of God at 3480 Refugee Rd and it will be livestreamed. This is where we need as many people as possible to hold our elected officials accountable on these important issues.

What are the BREAD issues? Even during the pandemic, BREAD has been working on affordable housing, gun violence, juvenile justice, a municipal id, eldercare, and police reform.
