

Month of the Sacred Heart

The weekend of June 20, we will take up a second collection for the support of tribal Evangelization in the catholic diocese of Warangal-India. This Evangelization program is aimed to carry the Gospel message to tribal people who live in rural areas and are deprived of the necessities like clean water, electricity, proper housing, education, healthcare, and sanitation. The tribal people have their own dialect and only to speak without a script. Priests, religious and a team of laity leaders are actively involved first to learn the dialect of the tribal and then catechize and promote education for children in this area. Sometimes our attempts at giving, even when giving our best, seems like a drop in an ocean of need. Our drop, combined with countless others, we cannot see, can come .
