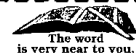

In the Gospel, the crowd asks Jesus for another miracle so that they will know God sent Him. Jesus just came from feeding five thousand people. What did they miss? I often feel like the crowd. How often do I experience God’s miracles in my life, yet quickly forget? I find myself asking God for more. As you draw closer to Jesus’ Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament, take the opportunity to recognize all that God has and is doing in your life.
