The Diocese of Columbus Vocations Office and Wilderness Outreach are sponsoring a discernment campout weekend for fathers and sons, October 15-17 at Tar Hollow State Park. The weekend will include camping, hiking, trail work, prayer and worship, and discussions around the campfire about the meaning of Catholic manhood and the priesthood.
