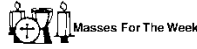

Black Catholic History Month 2021

On July 24, 1990, the National Black Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the long history and proud heritage of Black Catholics. During this month, take time to share in remembrance of our journey as a people and our personal journeys as individuals and families. Gather together and share our written and visual memories.

The National Black Catholic Clergy chose November for several reasons:

November 1 – All Saints Day – an opportunity to review lives of saints of African decent living in the first 300 years of Church history:

November 2 – All Souls Day – a time to remember the Africans lost in cruel treatment in the Middle passage crossing the Atlantic Ocean:

November 3 – Feast of St. Martin de Porres, who had been the only saint of African descent in this hemisphere:

November 20th – the death of Zumbi Palmares in Brazil, the South American founder of a free state for Blacks.

Black Catholic History Trivia

How many Popes were of African Descent? THREE

Telling of the story of the account of the baptism of the Ethiopian Eunuch.

In the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 8:26-40, we read the account of the Ethiopian eunuch. This was a black person baptized by Philip. The Ethiopian eunuch was the court official in charge of the treasury of the Queen of the Ethiopians. “Ethiopian” refer to a person of color from Africa. The Greeks used this word, which means “burnt” or darker skin.
