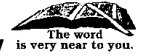


Wednesday Morning Bible Study

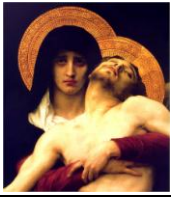

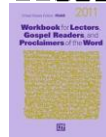
